

Did you know that nearly 500,000 children under the age of 5 die every year of curable disease? This statistic is shocking to many of us! It is for this reason that God has called some of us to MAKE a difference in our world through the area of compassion ministries!

I am excited to share with you about our restructured Missionary Nursing program. This former program has been restructured into our new **Bachelor of Science in Intercultural Healthcare**. We are excited to announce that this program has been approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Education.

This is an interdisciplinary healthcare program that we have structured to allow students to study Missions or Intercultural Studies while also being able to receive a certification/licensure in a healthcare field of their choice. This has allowed us to continue to do what we were doing before with our 2+2 program while also broadening the options for students. Students would be able to choose the field of nursing if they wish, but they would not be limited to nursing. They could also choose other certifications such as Radiology, Respiratory Therapy, Paramedic, or other studies, and then transfer in those credits and receive a Bachelor of Science. Students can also come to Penn View and take all of their course work on our campus through our Allied Health Care emergency medical services program. We are excited to see what God is going to continue to do through our students who have been called to missions, and gifted to use compassion ministries to make a difference around the world!

We firmly believe that God is still calling young people, and that He is calling some of them to specific healthcare fields! If that is you, we can help YOU to achieve your goals, while also preparing you to go to the mission field to make a difference for God!


## **Grandparents Day**


